Anthony Mainguené Foundation - International Research Chair in Comparative Studies on Occupational Health (CIECST) Thesis Award

Article 1 – Setting up of the Anthony Mainguené Foundation - CIECST Thesis Award

The Anthony Mainguené Foundation - CIECST Thesis Award is instituted with the support of the Anthony Mainguené Foundation which promotes ethical awareness, <https://www.fondation-anthonymainguene.org/>

This prize is intended to reward young researchers who have prepared their doctoral thesis and defended it during the year preceding that of the award.

Article 2 – Assessment Criteria

The objective of the Anthony Mainguené Foundation - CIECST Thesis Award is to distinguish young researchers whose dissertation subject deals in its developments with ethics in occupational health and occupational health policies, in accordance with the CIECST guideline. The research must explicitly present a forward-looking vision, how the centrality of ethical issues is addressed, its practical contribution and the innovation that is carried out. The comparative approach of the subject may also constitute an element of appreciation.

Article 3 – Amount of the Thesis Award

The Anthony Mainguené Foundation - CIECST Thesis Award is a prize of 3,000 euros, financed by the Anthony Mainguené Foundation, CIECST's partner.

The prize takes the form of support for the publication of a book, an article and/or the translation of an article. The purpose of this prize is to enable the award winner to promote his or her work.

The Award Winner has to mention in the publications resulting from his or her thesis work that he or she has obtained the Anthony Mainguené Foundation - CIECST Foundation Thesis Award.

Article 4 – Conditions of candidature

The Anthony Mainguené Foundation - CIECST Thesis Award is awarded every year until 2026 included, in June, for a PhD who has been defended his/her thesis the previous year.

A call for applications is launched from 1 January to 15 March of the year of the award.

The candidate has to provide a detailed summary of his/her thesis from 6 to 8 pages maximum as well as the report of the thesis jury, in French or in English or in Spanish, but also a 2 pages summary in French.

The complete application, in PDF format only, should be sent by email to ciecst@u-bordeaux.fr

After the call for applications, which runs until 15 March, the jury of the Thesis Award will examine the applications.

The Award Winner will be selected at the end of the Thesis Award jury meeting in early June.

The jury of the thesis prize is composed of members of the CIECST Scientific Committee, the Anthony Mainguené Foundation as well as external scientific personalities according to the subjects to be examined.

Article 5 – Conflicts of interest

The members of the jury are obliged to declare any conflict of interest in the assessment of applications.

A close professional relationship with a candidate (supervision of a thesis, co-authorship of articles, etc.), membership of the same research centre, as well as family, sentimental or friendly ties are not compatible with participation in the jury and deliberations.
